### PUBLIC HEARING ON CASE R19-02 PAUL STIRLING

The request has been submitted to change zoning from (O) Office to (SF) Single Family.

Present were P. Stirling and I. Banau, Agent Broker

Reason for request: structure (3 bedroom home) is no longer used as an office for the adjoining apartments and petitioner would like it to revert back to a single family dwelling, thus being eligible for a PRE.

Comments & Questions:

Question was raised relative to surrounding properties. North consists of commercial multi-family and all other surrounding properties are single family homes. Property is currently sewer and well.

Board commented that in their opinion it meets future goal of eliminating "spot" zoning. This property should not have been rezoned to begin with.

Mr. DePottey advised petitioner that this will be forwarded to the Township Board for review and final approval.

# **OLD BUSINESS / DISCUSSIONS**

Mr. Spillane advised the Board that the County is currently developing an ordinance restricting ORVs which would identify roads that will be restricted. Not sure at this time, but golf carts may or may not be included. Once the County ordinance is in place, local municipalities must wait one year before adopting their own ordinance. It was

noted that this could create a problem if we try to change or modify a year later. Enforcement could also be an issue. Specifically, County allows and Township does not. Genesee County is basing this on a current ordinance recently established in Lapeer County. Genesee County may also adopt an ORV sticker.

County timeline: first public hearing is scheduled for January 15, 2020 at 9 a.m. and could pass by Spring.

Board has decided to wait and review after Genesee County has passed ordinance.

Mr. Henry advised that a site review for Clayton Market (mobile home party store) gas tanks will probably be coming to the February meeting. Question was raised if that falls under the jurisdiction of the State Health Department. This will be addressed when review comes before this Commission.
