NEW BUSINESS

1. POSSIBLE REZONING M13/CORUNNA ROAD CORRIDOR

Mr. Henry met with the Assessor and was advised not to rezone the 3 residential parcels due to the impact it may have on resale, so only address the other parcels when considering re-zoning. After much discussion it was decided to wait until Sherman Heating & Cooling begins construction adjacent to this area and provide the owners along this corridor with an informational letter requesting input relative to their position on any zoning changes.

OLD BUSINESS

1. FOLLOW UP ON SOLAR ORDINANCE

Mr. Caruso advised the Commission that the Township Board has voted a moratorium on commercial solar farms till October, 2022.

Although the ordinance has progressed, to date, additional discussion and research will be required. Some of the open items which remain are relative to decommissioning and a method to tie any associated costs to the taxes in the lease agreement. A bond may not be the answer based on prior Township experience (statute of limitations). Bonds only run for 6 years in conjunction with the statute length. Tying to taxes can put an assessment on parcel and could result in loss of land to property owner.

The current protections in place for Township residents is the size restrictions and the requirement of a berm.

It was decided to wait to see if we get a response from ESA solar, which Mr. Caruso will report at next meeting.

2. FOLLOW UP ON FOUNDATION ORDINANCE

The Planning Commission reviewed all the changes discussed at last meeting and had no additional changes. It was noted that all other changes had been made in an attempt make ordinance uniform in terminology.
